An Introduction to Treehouse

As members of the Treehouse community, students can learn to build websites, create iPhone and Android apps, build web apps with Ruby on Rails and PHP, learn about user experience, how to start a business, and much more.

Through 1000+ video tutorials, quizzes, and code challenges created by expert teachers, students can learn to code in languages like Objective-C, HTML, CSS, PHP, Ruby, JavaScript and SQL.

Job Readiness

A driving force at Treehouse – as reflected in our mission – is to help our students *achieve their dreams and change the world*. We believe the best way to accomplish this is to guide our students from having no technology experience all the way through to being job-ready.

The Treehouse App

The Treehouse learning experience is delivered to our students via the Treehouse app. All content is accessible via our library and organized into courses by topic and tailored Tracks for our students. Each course is broken down into specific projects and Deep Dives to encourage students to master the languages and skills they learn.

As students embark on a project, Deep Dive or Track, their progress is saved in the comprehensive home, which acts as a dashboard and tracks an active student's progress and provides them with a personalised overview of what they're working on.

In addition to all of the learning content within the app, there are additional elements that expand on Treehouse learning to optimise our students' learning experience: the Treehouse forum is a place where our students engage and help one another; the job board lists job opportunities across the world that they can apply for; and the Treehouse iPad app offers a mobile learning experience.

Gamification

Learning should be engaging and fun, which is why gamification plays a part in how our students learn. As well as videos, project stages of Treehouse include interactive quizzes and code challenges. As students progress, badges and points assigned to content are unlocked. Detailed students profiles then publicly display unlocked badges and earned points.

Aiding the Learning Experience

As well as the extensive content within the app, we also offer additional external resources to aid and enhance the learning experience for our students: The Treehouse Blog is our way of sharing the latest news, trends, tips, and techniques from the web with the community; The Treehouse Show is an additional weekly dose of web design and web development news, hosted by Treehouse teachers Nick Pettit and Jason Seifer; And the Treehouse Book Series – authored by industry experts – offers an additional resource for students that covers specific topics in greater depth.

Treehouse Milestones

November 7, 2011: Treehouse Launch

- With \$650,000 in seed round funding from Kevin Rose, Reid Hoffman, David Sze, Josh Elman (Greylock Discovery Fund), Chamath Palihapitiya (The Social+Capital Partnership) and Mark Suster (GRP Partners) Treehouse officially launched.
- There were 7 members on the team.
- The Treehouse video studio was opened in Orlando, FL with other members of the team distributed across the US.

April 2012: Series A Round Funding

- We secured \$4.75 million in funding from The Social+Capital Partnership and the Greylock Discovery Fund.

September 2012: International Treehouse Scholarships

- We awarded 5,000 2-year Gold Treehouse memberships to students across the world.

November 2012: Treehouse's First Birthday

- Treehouse celebrated our first year of teaching and thanked our loyal and fantastic community of students for a wonderful and exciting year.

April 2013: Series B Round Funding

- \$7 million Series B round funding secured, led by Kaplan Ventures with participation from The Social+Capital Partnership.

Today

- We have 46,000+ active students.
- We are a trusted learning resource for companies including, Twitter, Square, Disney, Airbnb and Aol.
- With over 1000+ video tutorials available our students have unlocked over 1,000,000 Treehouse Badges.
- We have over 40 projects and Deep Dives in our Library.

Job Readiness

Through our comprehensive courses and Tracks, we guide our students down specific learning paths, all the while reinforcing and building on their skills to ensure they're constantly evolving and retaining an understanding of the content. We also believe it's important to ensure students are confident with their new skills and able to apply them to real-life projects. Typically we see students accomplish job readiness over a period of 6-12 months.

How Treehouse is Changing Lives

- American Treehouse Students of six months or longer reported earning \$10,000 more per year in comparison with new students.
- Earning 2,000 points on Treehouse corresponded with a \$10,000 increase in salary, given a self-reported sample of American Treehouse Students.
- American Treehouse Students who learn Web Design typically earn \$73,000 per year. This is 41% higher than the national average.
- American Treehouse Students of three months or longer earn on average 30% more than new students.
- Students who are placed as entry-level mobile developers, web designers and web developers typically start earning \$30,000 - \$40,000 per year.

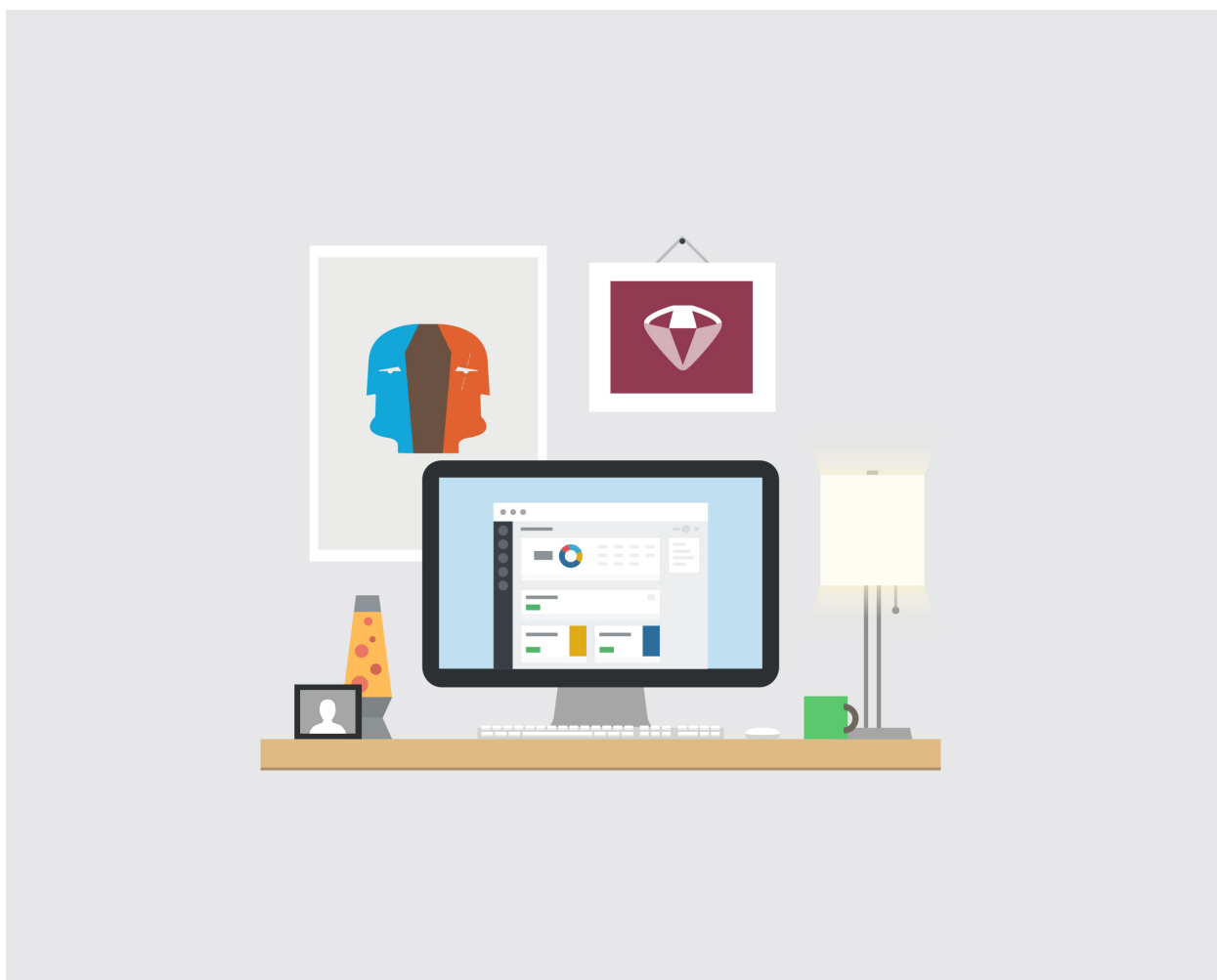


The Treehouse App

To start learning with Treehouse, the only software and hardware requirements are a web browser and an Internet connection. With a subscription, students can then log into the Treehouse app, where all content is accessible via the Treehouse library. Within the library video tutorials, quizzes and code challenges are organized into courses by topic. As students embark on a project, their progress is then saved in a comprehensive dashboard, which records an active students progress and provides them with a personalised overview of what they're working on.

Extending from the library of content, we also offer our students additional resources within the app including the forum, job board, and the recently released iPad app that expand on the Treehouse curriculum and optimise their learning experience.

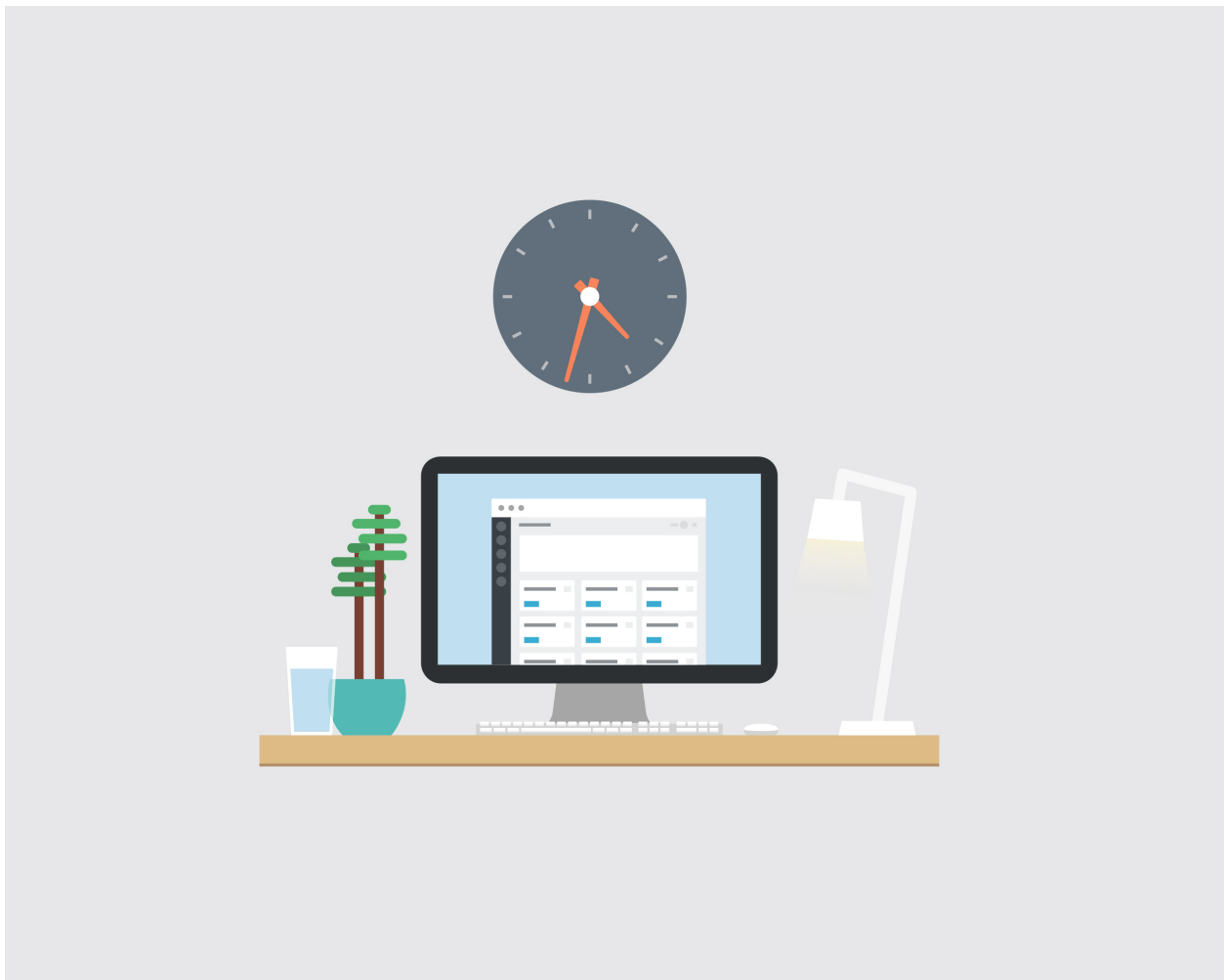

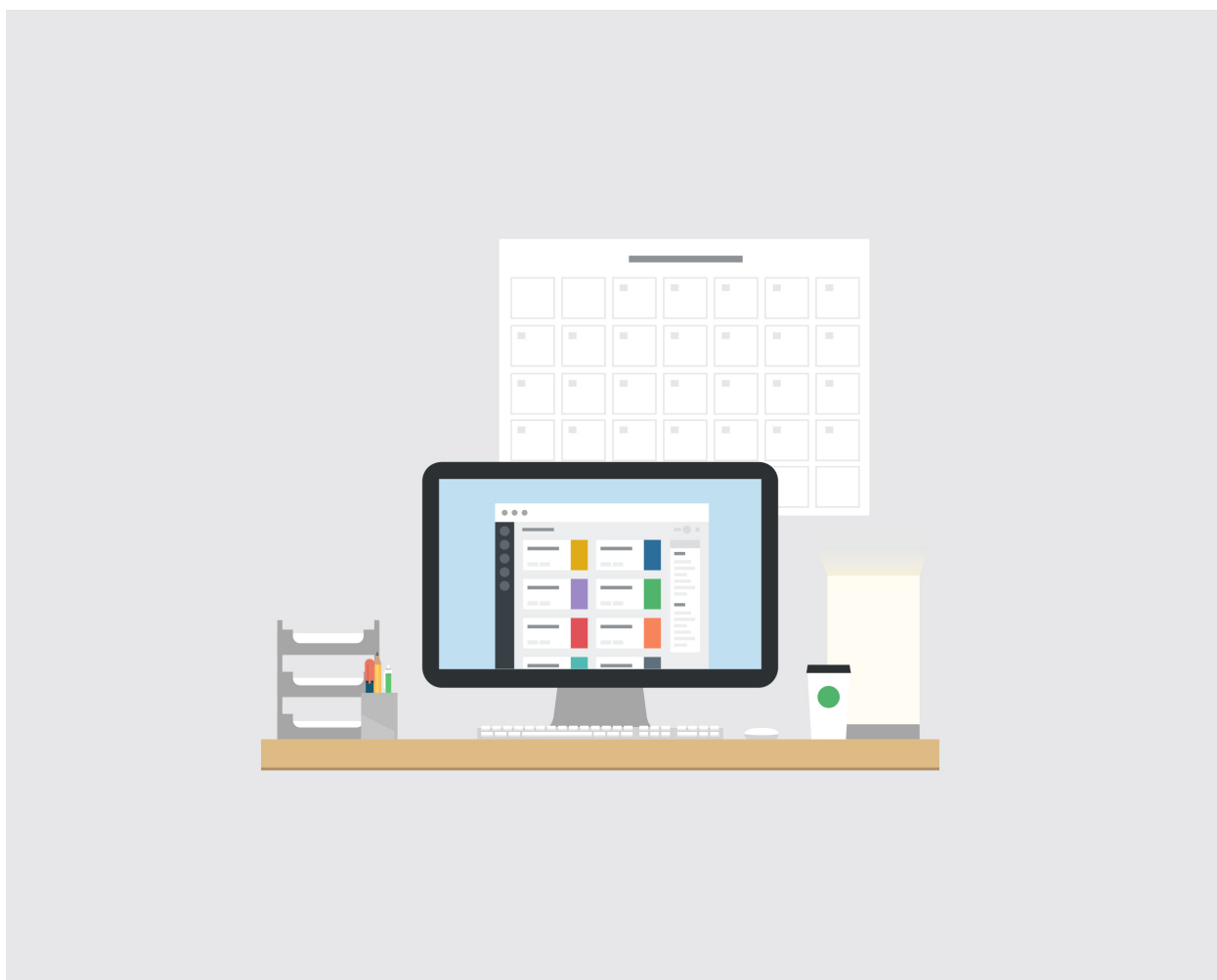

Tracks are guided curriculums designed to help students learn a new skill or train for a specific role. Tracks are compiled of multiple projects and Deep Dives in a logical order.

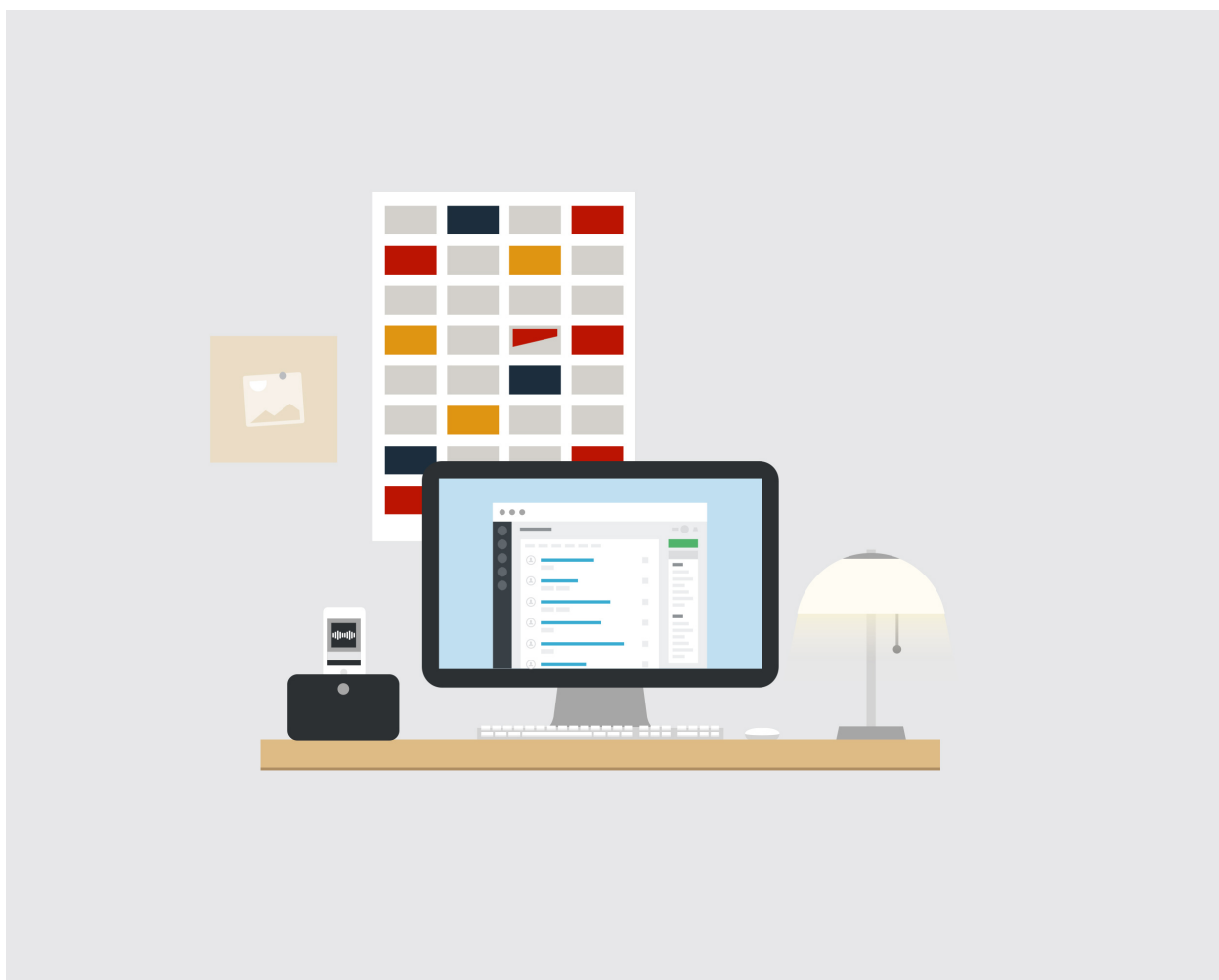

Library

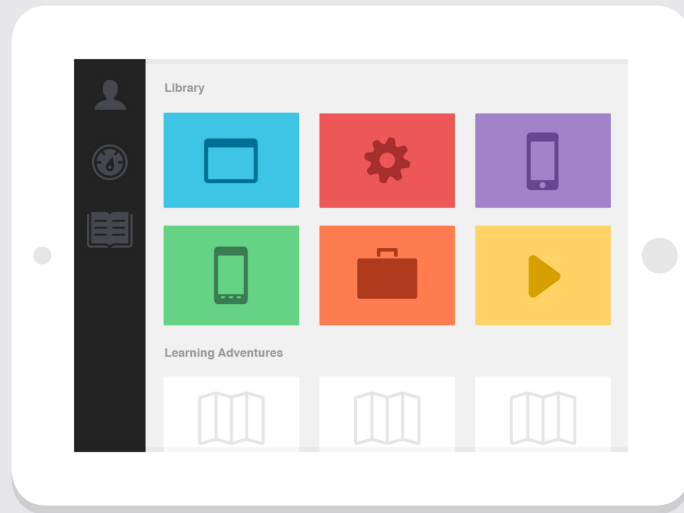
